Addiction Technology Transfer Center (ATTC) Leadership Institute for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Emerging Leaders

➤ By 2010, the demand for addiction professionals and licensed treatment staff with graduate-level degrees is projected to increase by 35 percent.

The ATTC National Office is offering a unique professional development opportunity for HBCU emerging leaders by hosting a Leadership Institute specifically designed for junior faculty who have taught, integrated or infused Substance Abuse/Mental Health in their teaching.

The ATTC Leadership Institute is a leadership preparation program providing a combination of:

- in-depth assessments
- distance education
- traditional training seminars
- field experience

Fourteen protégés will be selected from across the entire HBCU system and will be asked to partner with a mentor throughout the six-month process.
